The Kigali Amendment of The Montreal Protocol continues to be embraced by coutries around the world. The Amendment focuses on phasing down the use of HFC's globally over the next 30 years. #### **STRENGTHENING CEPA - HOT OFF THE PRESS**

The Canadian government has just announced a commitment to update the Canadian Environmental Protection Act 1999 (CEPA) to incorporate human rights in its processes. Its is believed vulnerable and marginalized Canadian communities are more likely to be harmed by environmental issues and need to be better protected under legislation. Environment and Climate Change Canada aims that policies should be adaptive and based in consultation, to incorporate less discriminatory policies that focus on the most vulnerable populations and account for the cumulative health effects of environmental issues. Further, they suggest a rights-based approach guards against discrimination and strengthens efforts to achieve a healthy environment for all by establishing that every person in Canada is entitled to a basic standard of environmental protection.
