The next one-day MOPIA certification classes will be held in **Brandon May 11** and in **Winnipeg May 13**. More dates will be added upon need/applicants.

Anyone working on A/C or HVACR systems handling regulated products and refrigerants must have this certification or they risk penalties of up to \$50,000 and/or imprisonment not exceeding six months on a first offence.

Profile on MOPIA

MOPIA is a unique, non-partisan, inclusive and not for profit organization which began in 1993/94 when the world was faced with the global threat and challenges of ozone depletion. This condition was an imminent threat to human kind and all species on earth. Perhaps the most significant environmental threat the world ever faced besides the nuclear dilemma. Climate change was a secondary issue at the time.

MOPIA was first appointed by the Hon. J. Glenn Cummings, Minister of Environment at the time under Manitoba's Premier Gary Filmon. Successive governments continue to see the value of our stakeholder led initiative. There is significant value to the provincial government as MOPIA is not dependent on any government funding.

MOPIA is governed by a volunteer Board of Directors. Our purpose is to assist industry in the phase-out of ozone depleting substances and provide specialized administrative assistance to government. Watch for your 2017-18 Certification Renewal in May



MOPIA will be issuing certification renewals for 2017-18 at the beginning of May. Watch for yours via personal mail or via your workplace mail.

The renewal fee remains unchanged at \$25 for the period June 1, 2017 – May 31, 2018. You may opt to pay for 2 years (2017-2018 and 2018-2019) at \$50. Payment may be made by cheque, debit, credit card or even via PayPal or cash (at the office).

Everyone who renews will be issued a new wallet certification card for 2017-18, as shown above. Penalties of non-compliance including working with a regulated substance are significant and may result in financial penalties of up **to \$50,000 and/or 6 months jail** on a first offence. Don't get caught without it and don't risk the consequences!!
