No Certification Card or Secondary Distributor Permit means - No Sale!!
Cards and Permits are not transferable.

TOUGH PENALTIES

Penalties exist for anyone purchasing and/or selling regulated products without a valid Certification Card. You may verify a card's validity by contacting MOPIA.

WHOLESALE & DISTRIBUTORS

Anyone selling regulated new or used air conditioning and refrigeration equipment, parts and/or refrigerant are obligated to see and record an MB-number off a valid Certification Card.

This wallet size card is mandatory for all persons servicing or purchasing regulated refrigerant(s), part(s) and equipment.

The card is issued annually and is needed when purchasing refrigerant or parts on the gas side of new or used refrigeration or air conditioning systems. Companies with a valid Secondary Distributor (SD) Permit may also purchase regulated products.

All new and used CFC, HCFC and HFC air conditioning and refrigeration equipment (and refrigerants) – anything attached to the closed refrigerant loop – is regulated and must only be sold to someone certified or a company that holds a Secondary Distributor Permit. Certification cards are not transferable and as such wholesalers/distributors must record who they are selling all regulated products by simply recording the SD Permit number or certification card MB number on the receipt/bill of sale, invoice for their records. Wholesalers/distributors must also verify who they are selling regulated products too by seeing it or obtaining a visible facsimile (i.e. scan/fax or email photo copy). If regulated products are sold to someone invalid or not certified or a company without a SD Permit or owner operator certification they are liable for penalties/fines of up to \$500,000 on a first offense!

This applies to internet sales too, which are also now being monitored. Just ask the chap in Selkirk who's URL was tracked had Environment Officers knock at his residence!
