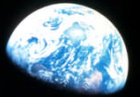

## Proposed: Increased Fines in CEPA Regulations

If you work at or service federal facilities or undertakings, be aware that fines will increase under the proposed regulations which would amend the Regulations Designating Regulatory Provisions for Purposes of Enforcement (Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999) (Designation Regulations). Subsections 5(1) and (2) of the Federal Halocarbon Regulations, 2003 would be added to Item 16 of the Schedule of the Designation Regulations.

The Designation Regulations complete the application of the new fine regime under the Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999 introduced by the Environmental Enforcement Act ([www.ec.gc.ca/alef-ewe/default.asp?lang=En&n=2AAFD90B-1](http://www.ec.gc.ca/alef-ewe/default.asp?lang=En&n=2AAFD90B-1)).

Under the regime, which came into force in June 2012, designated offences involving direct harm or risk of harm to the environment, or obstruction of authority, are subject to an increased fine range.

These proposed amendments were published in the Canada Gazette, Part I. It initiates a 75-day public comment period. ## Refrigerant Management Canada ODS Cylinder Return Depots

Refrigerant Management Canada (RMC) is Canada's refrigerant management waste disposal stewardship initiative for those in the stationary refrigeration and air conditioning sectors. See: [www.refrigerantmanagement.ca/](http://www.refrigerantmanagement.ca/)

Refrigerant returned to participating wholesalers (below) is shipped via RMC to a processing centre where it is analyzed and either re-processed or destroyed (high heat incineration). Typically there is no cost for this service as a levy was originally collected at the point of sale of the refrigerant which is used to fund the RMC refrigerant program.

Refrigerants (i.e. surplus or contaminated) outside of the stationary HVAC sectors (i.e. automotive, white goods sectors) are not formally partners in this program, so disposal is left for contractors who may either source other service providers (i.e. Miller Environmental) or simply safely store surplus refrigerants for the time being.
